In Part II, we will review our lowercase letters, continue with the uppercase 'Letterforms and alphabets, and begin introducing elegant flourishes into our work. This session offers clear demonstrations, hands-on guidance, and personalized feedback to help you elevate your script with confidence.



In this class, we will pick up where you left off in Calligraphy 101 by exploring paper options, nibs, pens, and ink. We will stuff your “tool kits” with a collection of new ideas and opportunities to practice techniques that will add affect to your calligraphic work.

Violet delights in sharing her love of calligraphy, watercolor, and mixed-media expression, inviting others into the joy of making art. Her pieces have appeared in numerous juried exhibitions, and her work now lives on in cherished private collections.

Supplies

- ½" Flat brush, Heinz Jordan Gold Sable 850 series (synthetic) or WN 995, Princeton Velvet Touch 1/2" 3950W - it needs to a good spring to the brush
- Watercolour paper, student grad, pads like Canson or Strathmore - 90# or 140# and or Strathmore watercolour cards
- Any scraps or off-cuts of watercolour paper you may have on hand
- Bond paper or white cardstock for practice
- Watercolours (pan or tube, professional or student grade)
- Optional: Rigger (also known as a Script or Liner brush-inexpensive brush is fine)
- Palette for mixing paint (Are you new to watercolour; buy a Prang 16 Pan Set)
- Water containers, spray bottle, paper towels
- Pencil HB, kneadable eraser
- Embossing tool (2mm head)



In these classes, you will explore painting with a flat brush, also referred to as a chisel brush. You will develop the ability to manipulate the brush; control the angles and pressure changes to capture the "essence" of some of your favourite garden flowers.




VERSALS, those beautiful capital letters

which traditionally indicate the beginning of bodies of text, have drawn our eyes to the page for centuries. Versals are typically colorful, often decorated, and always full of life, no matter how simply drawn. Beginning with a simple analysis of the Roman alphabet, we will embark on a journey through the ages with Versals as our guide. Participants in this workshop will be gently guided through the process of developing their very own constructed, or drawn, Versal letters with the benefit of historical reference to draw from.

~Supplies~

PEN HOLDERS AND NIBS

~Broad edge nibs and pointed pens. We will typically be working with smaller broad edge nibs or pointed pens.

INK

~Black Ink (Sumi Moon Palace recommended)

GOUACHE

~Small tube(s) (Holbein, Winsor & Newton, Schmincke) or pan set.

WATERCOLOR

~Small tube(s) or pans (Winsor & Newton, Daniel Smith, Dr. Martin QoR)

FINE POINTED BRUSHES

~ 000, 00, and 1 are good range of sizes. The smaller and finer, the better, for detail work. An old "retired" brush for mixing colors (can be poor quality!) The more, the merrier!

PAPER

~Tracing Paper, Mixed media paper of your choosing.

PAINT PALETTE

~A small well palette will do just fine. Porcelain, enamel or plastic.

SHARP PENCIL

~I like to use a medium-hard lead .05 HB mechanical pencil. Others prefer a softer lead still others prefer a reg wooden pencil. Just so long as you keep it sharp!

ERASERS

~Clean plastic erasers such as Staedtler/Mars, Tombow or clean kneaded eraser.

RULER

~Metal will give you more accurate measuring and a good, straight, sharp, edge.

TAPE

~Artist tape, or removable scotch tape, 1/2" or 3/4" roll.

MISC.

Water container and paper towels or clean up cloths.

OPTIONAL


Slant Board/Desk that slants up to 20 degrees or more (not required but highly recommended)

Any stiff board, even two pieces of Foamcor taped together measuring at least 18" x 20"

(Masonite works best; gatorfoam and plexiglass work well also)

T square, Triangle, X-acto knife




Is it time to freshen it up... and take it up a notch? Dust off your Italic lettering in this three part class. We'll review the basic letterforms, play with capital and some flourishing then introduce the pointed pen Italic to make them even more elegant.

This will mainly be a technique class although homework will be assigned to use your lettering in a small project.

It all started with a Christmas gift of a beginner cartridge pen & book and has progressed to formal training with the nib & ink. Her first love is the italic hand and it's still her go-to style for beauty, rhythm and grace. She love to share it with others and see their faces light up when they get the perfect 'a' or 's'!




SUPPLY LIST

- Assorted Broad Edged Nibs - Including a Speedball C2 or equivalent.
- Pointed Nib (Blue Pumpkin or equivalent).
- Penholder (and oblique pen holder if required for your pointed nib).
- Black Ink (Higgins Eternal or your favourite).
- Grid Pad and several sheets of plain white bond paper.
- Quote to practice
- Pencil, Ruler & White eraser.

Homework will require

- Watercolour paper (90 or 140 lb)
- Coloured inks or paints and small paintbrush.

Note - Students will be required to rule up sheets of grid paper prior to the first class. Instructions will be provided in a class email.

Discover the joy of serendipitous design in this paste paper workshop. A mixture of coloured starch paste is applied to paper and using various tools [combs, brushes, stamps, etc.] you can create unique, often three-dimensional patterns and textures into your wet medium.

You will create a collection of richly textured, one-of-a-kind papers to use in your future artistic endeavours.

Book covers, endpapers, box making, journal covers and booklets or gift tags.

The first section of this two part class will be to apply and decorate your paper with the paste.

The second part will be to create a simple booklet using your dry decorative paper. A few additional supplies will be needed however the majority of supplies are included in the course fee.
